We all know that at some point, each of us will leave this world, and Oli's case it happened far, far sooner than any of us could ever have imagined. To this day, we often find ourselves locked in a moment trying to answer the unanswerable question of 'why?'. We will never know. But in these moments, one of Oli's wonderful quotes in his book; Sam Leaper's Little Book of Wisdom, snaps us out of it. He says:

"You have power over your mind – not outside events. Realise this and you will find strength".

And it's with the strength and inspiration that our lovely Oli's words and approach to life have helped us navigate the last 4 years. With him by our side, and with the support of you, our wonderful Magic Future Foundation community, you will read on the following pages that together we've already created a lasting legacy in his honour that we know he'd be proud of.

Before Oli died, we'd often talked about building more schools as a family, having already built four in 2013. We even joked that as Madonna had built fourteen schools with our partner buildOn, how great it would be to be able to say, "we've beaten Madonna". Well, we've done it Oli! Oh, how he'd be smiling now!

He may not be here in person, but he's with us every day. Today, he fills our thoughts. As a family we are spending time together, appreciating some generous hosting and care from the wonderful team at Domaine Des Etangs in France. An opportunity to be together, peaceful and think about Oli.

If we break the minefield of emotions down, three words spring to mind – pride, reflection, and gratitude.

As we look back, we're so proud of Oli and the man he'd become; his approach to life, love, and energy, his boundless optimism. Pride in how many people's lives he's now touching as a result of his 100 Schools Project.


IMPACT beyond numbers

SUSTAINABLE IMPACT


Generation by generation

"10 years ago, I was in Zambia, staying in a hotel on the Zambezi. The owners of the hotel had built a school and we were invited to visit. I confess that initially (and somewhat cynically) I thought this might be a tourist trap. How wrong I was. The minute I walked into the school, my perspective shifted in an instant. The happiness and joy we witnessed the room blew my mind. The pupils were not only conscious of their good fortune but grateful and unrelenting in their desire to make the most of it. Suffice it to say they were not the only ones taught a lesson that day!

As a lucky public-school boy from England, I was taken aback. I instantly decided to help a school. Ironically, when I look back, in many ways, this gesture had just as big an impact on me as it did for the school. This experience stays with me to this day.

When Oli tragically died, on an island that means a lot to me personally, and I learned about Stefan, Diana, Alex, and Max's commitment to build 100 schools in his honour, there was no doubt in my mind that I wanted to do whatever I can to help them achieve it.

If we can alleviate poverty for individuals and consequently countries around the world, I strongly believe it is the greatest gift we can give this planet.

Like the Wissenbach family, I am incredibly grateful that you support the Magic Future Foundation, and I am in awe of what Oli has created and the effect he's having on the world.

There's a remarkably simple but powerful mindset with which we approach the next phase of fundraising for future school builds. It's based on an approach Stefan learned from his friend Dan Sullivan at Strategic Coach – and one which can be applied to many aspects of our lives. It's called "The Gap". Dan says:

"How we measure our progress on our goals is not only a game changer, it's a life changer.

Measure forward against the ideal, and we're headed for "The Gap," my term for the space between where we currently stand and the ideal. When we're in The Gap, we feel like we're failing, we become disillusioned, dissatisfied, and unhappy with ourselves — and our confidence plummets.

Measure back from where we are currently to where we started, and we're rewarded by all the progress we've made. We feel happy and satisfied about how things are going, and our confidence takes an immediate leap".

Each one of the 24 schools we've built so far is a beacon of hope and opportunity. We should all be immensely proud of this significant milestone. Despite the fact there's still a lot of work to be done, with 76 more schools needed to reach our ultimate goal – and yes, it's a big number - there is no way we're in the gap! Our confidence is higher today than it's ever been.

We and you together are a force for change. With your continued dedication and generosity, we are confident that we can make this dream a reality. Together, we've got this. Together, we will transform even more lives.



Every 200 bricks you sell, gives one person in your team the opportunity to book a place to travel and attend the build ceremony and meet the community who's lives will be changed forever for the better. Truly a life changing experience for you, your family or your friends.

Step 7.

Present your school with their 'Poster of Purpose'. Everyone who buys a brick gets to 'virtually' attach a name to their brick.

Each name is added to a "Poster of Purpose" which is presented to the village to display within their new school. Inspiring the students each and every day to fulfil their potential and believe in themselves,

because of all the fundraisers who believed in them too.

On the morning of Oli's 29th birthday on 23rd August, Stefan received a heartfelt message from a good friend. It simply said: 'significant days are the hardest to bear'. Today is undoubtedly another one of those days.

Anyone who knows us will appreciate how passionate we are about the power of mindset, its life-changing powers, and how it can help carry you on darker days. As a family, we continue to focus our mindset on celebrating Oli, reflecting on great memories and the gift that we had of his 25 years. And, when you next have a tough time or a rough day, reflect on your mindset and remember you have the power to choose.

In Oli's book, Sam Leaper's Little Book of Wisdom, he wrote about his purpose: The World Better Because he was here. A meaningful purpose also has tremendous power. What's yours?

Ultimately, your purpose should be a reflection of your values, priorities, and the impact you hope to have on the world. It serves as a reminder not only of your life but of the values and lessons you wish to pass on to future generations. In Oli's case, the world is certainly better because he was here.

With 24 Schools now built in his honour, it comforting to know that each one will have a small amount of Oli's ashes in its foundations that support the growth and potential provided by one of his passions – education.

The eagle-eyed amongst you will have noticed that, in the last 12 months, we have added a mission to our vision and purpose -
